
Busy Buzzy Busy Bee

FORMATION: Children sit in a circle.

GAME: One student is chosen to be the 'Busy Bee'.

- As the song is sung, the 'Busy Bee' skips around the outside of the circle and at the end of every bar they give a 'bee card' to the student they are standing behind. (I.e. on the words 'bee', 'tree' and 'me'.)
- Once the song ends and they have given out 4 cards, the 4 chosen students and the 'busy bee' move to the left to find the nearest empty space to sit in. As they do this, they all pretend to be bees by 'walking' on their knees, flapping and buzzing.
- The student who doesn't find a spot in the circle is the next 'Busy Bee'.
